

















Stvolínky are a village in the Czech Lípa District, in the Liberec Region. First written mentioning is from the year 1197 In the second half of the 14th century a Gothic fortified settlement with a 10 to 12 m wide trench was built. By the end of this century, we have the first mentioting of th All Saints Church and a nearby castle, Ronov. In 1505 this settlement became a town. In the 16th and 17th century biggest changes where done. This town became an important market place, it grew in it's numbers, there was a common hospital, castle Ronov was abandoned. It also gained a brewing privilege and a brewery was built.

In 1647 Stvolínky were bought by cardinal Harrach for a new bishoprie in Litoměřice for a sum of 53 000 golden coins. It was the biggest owner change that impacted the town. In the 19th century the town gained it's own post, a telegraph, and later functioning waterpipes. Both WW1 and WW2 were














STVOLÍNKY, BEFORE 1945, SOUTH-WEST VIEW





















































GRAINERY, BEAM STRUCTURE, BEFORE 2008
